Using Your Plane-R-Board

The key to control of the Plane-R-Board is to keep the tow line out of the water. The distance your Plane-R-Board can be from the boat is directly related to the height of your tow line as well as sea conditions. For easiest deployment and retrieval of your Plane-R-Board, use a Cannon Plane-R-Reel™. Made in standard and elite models, these reels have a built-in clutch/lock; they provide safe, neat towline storage, and let you crank in your Plane-R-Boards quickly and easily. Plane-R-Reels can be fastened directly to your boat, or to a Cannon Plane-R-Boom™as pictured.


Tie a swivel clip to the end of your towline. For starboard trolling (right side of boat, facing bow), clip towline to the top eyelet. For port side trolling, simply flip the Plane-R-Board over and clip towline to the top eyelet. Whichever direction the Plane-R-Board is used always clip the towline to the top eyelet.

To start trolling, pull out several feet of towline and toss board into water slightly away from side of boat. Then unreel the desired length of towline to fit fishing conditions and the number of lines you plan to fish. (Most reels come with up to 150 feet of towline).

CAUTION: You should never attempt planer board fishing in congested areas because it is too easy for other boats to cut across your lines - or even cut your towline. (Cannon towline is fluorescent yellow to help prevent this from happening.)

CAUTION: Conditions will exist where Plane-R-Boards cannot be used. Use caution


PLANE-R-REEL MOUNTED ON WINDSHIFT D



Plane-R-Board Fishing Suggestions

You can use one Plane-R-Board, on either side of your boat, or two at once - one on each side... And you can fish one line or several lines off each Board. Cannon's adjustable-tension Quick Release™ is ideal for this purpose: 1) Unreel the length of fishing line you want to troll, 2) Slip the line between the Quick Release gripper pads, 3) Adjust the tension to fit your line weight and the release force you prefer, 4) Fasten the clip over the Plane-R-Board towline, and 5) Let it play out to the distance from the boat you want to troll that lure.

The fishing line furthest out must be deployed first, of course. Be sure that the next line(s) deployed go undemeath the first, to prevent tangling when you get a strike.

Mounting Your Flag

Grasp the stem and push firmly into the 1/4" dia. hole located on the top rail of the inward board only. The pointed tip of the stem will make its own hole in the Ethafoam the first time used and will hold firmly even after removing and inserting thousands of times. If the flag is lost or damaged

Tie a snap swivel to the end of your towline and clip to the towing eyelet of the board. To start trolling pull out several feet of towline, and toss the board into the water with the angled ends forward and slightly away from the side of the boat. Unreel the desired length of towline to fit fishing conditions and the number of lines you plan to fish. (CANNON reels come with 150 feet of towline.)








PLANE-R-REEL SHOULD BE MOUNTED TOWARD BOW OF BOAT




